



## **PGI Fishing Club 2010 Ladder of Angling Achievement Program**

### **Who**

- Limited to members of the PGI Fishing Club.

### **General Rules**

- When you join the Club you automatically earn “Angler” status. There are seven levels above “Angler”.
  1. Bronze Class Angler
  2. Silver Class Angler
  3. Gold Class Angler
  4. Lifetime Master Angler Level 1
  5. Lifetime Master Angler Level 2
  6. Lifetime Master Angler Level 3
  7. Grand Master Angler
- All entries must be caught in local waters (within a 50 mile radius of PGI).
- Fish caught out of season are eligible for entry, but must be returned to the water after a photo is taken.

### **How to Earn Levels**

- Bronze Class Angler - Five (5) different species of any fish on the list. There are no size limits.
- Silver Class Angler - Five (5) different legal size fish, of any species on the list and earn a minimum of 300 points.
- Gold Class Angler - Seven (7) different legal size fish, of any species on the list and earn a minimum of 700 points.
- Lifetime Master Angler Level 1 - Nine (9) different legal size fish, of any species on the list and earn a minimum of 1000 points.
- Lifetime Master Angler Level 2 - Thirteen (13) different legal size fish, of any species on the list and earn a minimum of 1400 points.
- Lifetime Master Angler Level 3 - Eighteen (18) different legal size fish, of any species on the list and earn a total of 1700 points.
- Grand Master Angler - Twenty-three (23) different legal size fish, of any species on the list and earn a total of 2000 points.

### **Recording/Reporting Fish**

- All entries are cumulative, once you enter a legal size fish, it and any points earned will count toward the next award level.
- All entries must be caught in local waters (within a 50 mile radius of PGI).
- A photograph of the fish with your name, fish species, length, and date caught, noted on the back of the photo, or in the body of your email, will be your entry form, (honor system must prevail).
- The photo is now your entry form for all club fishing events, the Master Angler Tournament, the Ladder of Achievement Program and the Fish of the Month Contest.
- Eligibility for each program will be determined by the Club’s appointed scorekeeper.
- All entries should be emailed to the Fishing Events Director at [PGIFishingClub@pgica.org](mailto:PGIFishingClub@pgica.org), or drop it off at the PGICA facility and placed in the fishing clubs folder, or handed in at one of the monthly club meetings.
